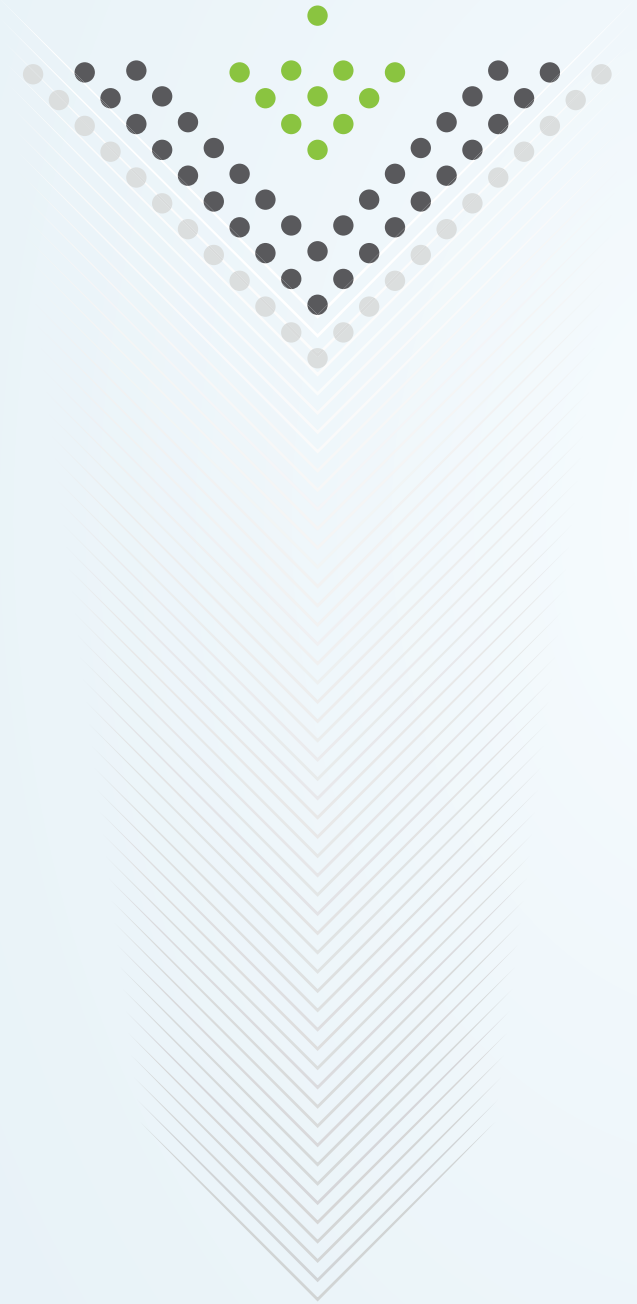

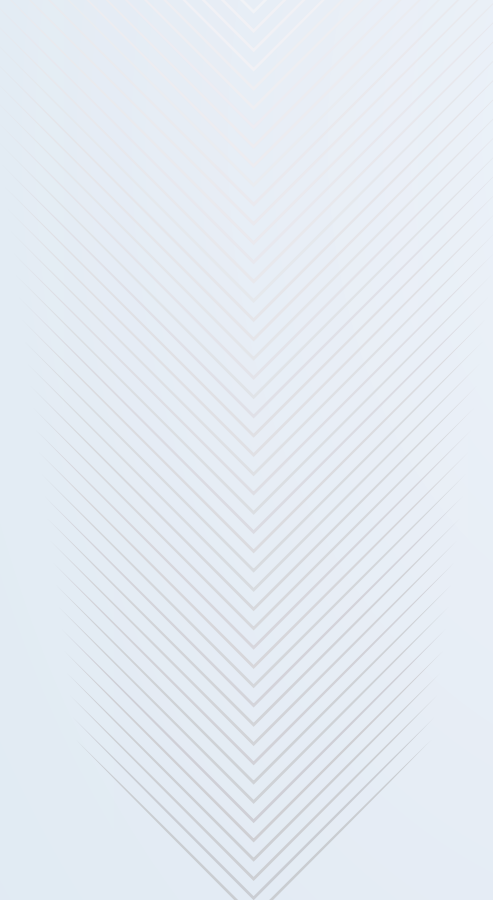

**ISSH Members celebrating Golden Jubilee year 2023-24**

The Golden Jubilee celebration of the ISSH was held on 8 September, 2023 at the ISSHCON 2023, in a glittering function befitting the honourable Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand. The function kickstarted at the Main Hall of Hotel Mountview, Chandigarh on 8 September, 2023 at 4 pm.

It started with an Intro to the Program by the President of ISSH, Dr Santhosh Rath, and Dr G Karthikeyan took over as Master of Ceremonies.

The theme video of the Program was played to resounding applause. The logo of the Golden Jubilee, which had been designed by Ms Shailee, daughter of ISSH member Dr Shailesh Gupta, was also released. Dr Ajeesh Sankaran and Dr Shailesh Gupta were applauded for their efforts!

## ISSHCON 2023 Report

The 46th annual conference of Indian Society for Surgery of Hand, ISSHCON 2023 was organised by Department of Plastic Surgery, Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Chandigarh. It was held at Hotel Mountview, Sector 10, Chandigarh from 8th to 10th September. It was attended by 225 hand surgeons from India and abroad.



Apart from hand surgeons, 35 hand therapists also participated and held their meeting SHTICON 2023 on 8th and 9th September in the same venue. The conference was inaugurated by Prof Dr Vivek Lal, Director of PGIMER, Chandigarh in presence of President ISSH, Dr Santosh Rath. Secretary ISSH, Dr Anil Bhat, Executive Trustee ISSH, Dr S Raja Sabapathy, Organizing Chairman, Dr Atul Parashar, Organizing Secretary, Dr Satyaswarup Tripathy, Scientific Chairman Dr Parmod Kumar and Scientific Co Chairman Dr Sunil Gaba.



A souvenir cum abstract book was released on the occasion. The meeting was packed with rich scientific contents in the form of video workshop, master classes, orations, keynote lectures, symposiums, invited lectures, best paper award sessions (consultant and resident categories), free papers and e-poster presentations with a whopping overall 140 oral presentations and 35 e-posters.



This year was a special year for the ISSH in the sense that the society has crossed the 50 years since its inception in 1973. So a special session named as "Golden Jubilee Celebration" programme was part of the function on first day where twelve past presidents of the association were specially invited and felicitated. The event unfurls the history of the formation of the society and evolution of hand surgery in our country. It also entailed upon the targets for the future of hand surgery in India.



The Emperor Asoka Award Oration for excellence in hand surgery was conferred to Dr Michael Tonkin from Australia who deliberated on "A life of Congenital Hand Surgery: Reflection and Observations". There were six master classes in 3 different halls by our esteemed faculties distributed over two days.



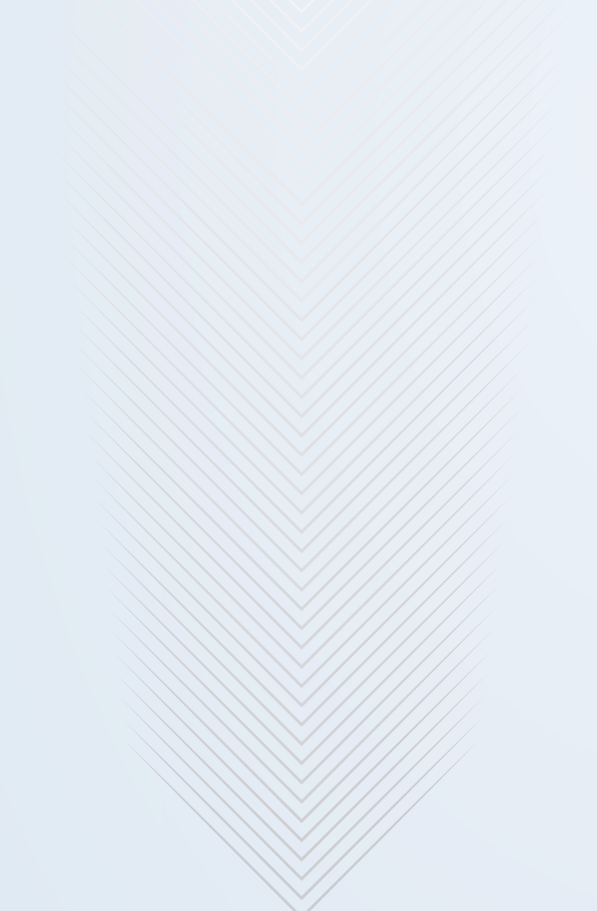

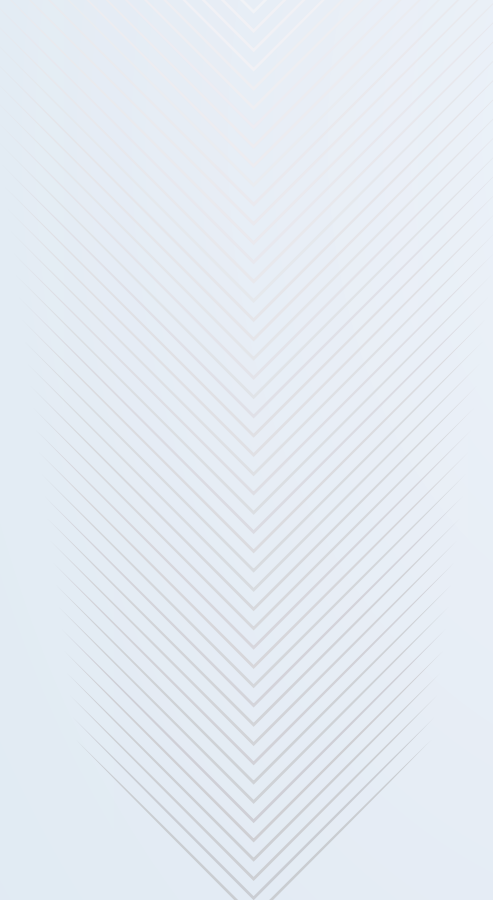
